WHEN TO CALL 111

Call 111 when immediate help is required with a life-threatening or time-critical emergency.

For example:

- People are seriously injured or in danger
- There is a serious risk to life or property
- A crime is being or has just been committed and the offenders are nearby
- There is a major public inconvenience (e.g. Road or Highway is obstructed)
- If in doubt, call 111. The call-taker will make a decision as to what action to take

NON-URGENT INCIDENTS

Any other matters that do not require urgent Police attention, either visit the North Shore Policing Centre in Parkway Drive, Rosedale, or call (09) 477-5000.

Check Fire Alarm Batteries annually.
Check Civil Defence kit. Update as required.
Have a 'get away plan' for use in emergency.
Know your Neighbours.
Let neighbours know when away from home for an extended period.

Record Serial Numbers.
Keep photographs of important and valuable items.

Have deadlocks on external entry doors.

Use a deadlock on internal entry from garage.

Internal entry door from garage should be of solid material.

Window locks are a good idea.

Do not rely on window stays for security when away from home.

A visible intruder alarm is a useful deterrent.

Security lighting needs to be carefully placed so as not to intrude on neighbouring property.

GRAFFITI

REMOVAL AND PREVENTION

The most effective strategy against graffiti vandalism is to remove it as quickly as possible.

It is recommended that graffiti be reported as soon as it is noticed.
